At FIU, we are fortunate to have a First-Generation Scholarship that is supported by an innovative matching grant program. For every \$1 donated to the scholarship program, the State of Florida matches \$2.

The program was sponsored and partly written into law in 2006 by FIU alumna and current Florida State Senator Anitere Flores. 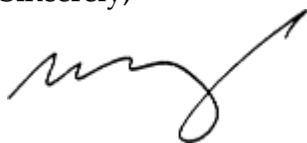
